ENRICHMENT WORKSHOPS

Kindergarten through Eighth Grade

Each two-week morning workshop is designed to enhance both academic and social skills. With highly skilled teachers, small class sizes, a supportive learning environment, and a variety of engaging educational materials, students are encouraged to develop a love for learning that extends beyond the classroom.

Kindergarten

Young Scholars Workshops focus on building foundational literacy, including phonics, sight words, and reading comprehension. Students will also have the opportunity to become authors and illustrators through the introduction of the writing process and practicing their handwriting. First Grade

Writing and Illustration Workshops provide writing and drawing activities that help budding illustrators and authors develop their skills within a structured framework. Fourth and Fifth Grades

Language Arts Strategies Workshops will use a variety of short stories as a foundation for exploring character development, plot prediction, personification, and point of view. Students will learn to apply these literary elements in their own writing. Through a structured writing process, they will learn how to compose an well-organized paragraph, essay, short story, or "quick write." The workshops will also focus on developing organizational and critical thinking skills, reading for deeper meaning, and refining editing and proofreading techniques as well as mastering grammar and punctuation. Each workshop will offer its own engaging and meaningful projects.

Fifth-Eighth Grades

In the Engineering/Robotics Workshop, students will engage in hands-on activities that integrate engineering, robotics, coding, math, and problem solving. Working collaboratively, participants will design, build, and program robots to tackle various challenges. This experience will enhance their understanding of the real-world applications of algebra and geometry.

Sixth-Eighth Grades

In the Theatre Workshop, students will be introduced to performance techniques and participate in stagecraft activities, as well as perform character monologues, short plays, and improvisational scenes. Alongside learning and applying theatre terminology, the main focus will be to develop a strong and impactful stage presence.

In the Language Arts Workshop, students will explore short stories and fairy tales to analyze character development, plot prediction and symbolism and will apply these techniques to their own writing. Using a guided writing process, participants will craft impactful "quick writes" and short stories to share with their peers. The workshop will also focus on enhancing organizational skills, critical thinking, and reading for deeper meaning along with the proper use of grammar and punctuation.
